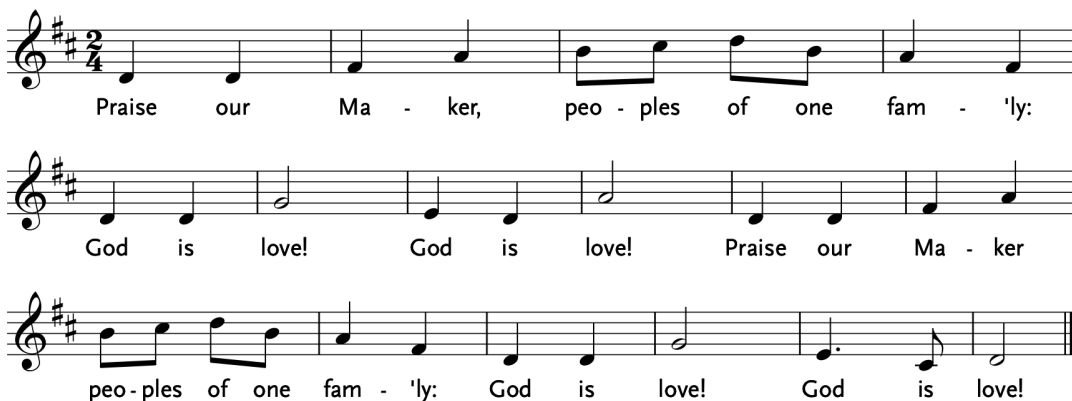

WORSHIP NOTES

The Anthem is by the contemporary Scottish composer James MacMillan. *A New Song* was composed in 1997, and contains many of MacMillan's hallmark sonorities: vocal ornamentation influenced by traditional Scottish music; modal melodies; contrapuntal sections; and a creative, unusual form. The atmospheric organ accompaniment is especially fascinating: throughout the majority of the piece, the organ whispers and flutters around the choir like a hovering spirit, but then rises to prominence, bringing the piece to a dramatic and powerful close.

The setting of the *Jubilare Deo* sung this morning was composed as the second in a set of two morning canticles (along with a famous setting of the *Te Deum*) that Howells wrote for the choir of King's College, Cambridge (known in Latin as *Collegium Regale*). This collaboration turned out to be remarkably fruitful: in addition to the morning canticles, Howells composed a set of evening canticles (*Magnificat* and *Nunc dimittis*) for the King's College choir, as well as a setting of the complete Anglican communion liturgy. Howells' evocative and utterly distinctive compositional voice is at the very height of its maturity in these pieces, and their sound has arguably redefined the aesthetics of church music ever since.
